AIRWE

AIRWE (***Akal Institute of Rural Women Empowerment***) is a free residential program run by Kalgidhar Trust for underprivileged young women from the remote areas of North India. They are being educated with the blend of modern scientific education and spiritual learning which usually take 4-6 years depending upon the level of education completed by them at the time of admission. The center is affiliated to NIOS board and Eternal University (UGC approved).

After completing education here, these girls become eligible enough to easily secure service as educators in reputed schools. During their stay in this academy, these students are provided with free boarding, lodging, medical and other facilities.

The department has been arranging special classes from time to time to trained Students for performances at various platforms. Profound artists and experts from the field of Classical Music and Religious Studies Sangeet are being called for the training.

He visited our department from 2012 to 2015 and played an important role in reviving the playing technique of old Religious Studies Music Instruments.
2. **Ustad Surjit Singh ji** – he is an outstanding Religious Studies Sangeet artist. He is expertise in Vocal and is the writer of many exclusive books on Religious Studies Sangeet with notation system. He has served the Institution from the very beginning and has trained many students in filed.
3. **Pandit Harsh Narayan ji**- he is the famous sarangi player from Mumbai. He has guided the students for advance learning in playing instruments.
4. **Ustaad Sukhdev Singh Ji**:- Presently, he is visiting every month for to trained the students for group performances. Ustad Sukhdev Singh ji is maestro of Religious Studies Sangeet from Bhaini Sahib. He is disciple of famous Hindustani Vocalist Pandi Rajan Sajan Mishra ji. He is training students for both vocal & playing instruments.

5. Goal of the Project

This unique program for women Educational Skill Development Program we take all students from Class 10th and 12th girls belonging to the lower strata of remote rural areas from the rural areas of North India. The Kalgidhar Society will give intensive Educational Skill Training in English language and communication skills, modern teaching methodology and computer education. All students will be uplifted in spiritual concept, moral values and dedicated services to humanity with compassion and love, with a thought that teachers should be role models in all aspects not only for the students but for the Society also.

This program has already benefitted and placed 2000+ rural girls till date. Entire expenses for Skill training including boarding & lodging are provided free of cost till date but since the strength of beneficiaries is growing rapidly and there is a huge demand for this program amongst the rural targeted areas; the Society is incapable of meeting such finance as ongoing support.

6. Area of Project Activities:

It is proposed to implement this women teacher training program in **Baru Sahib, backward hilly areas of Himachal Pradesh.**

7. Follow Up and Monitoring Process

The Kalgidhar Society is known as transparent working culture & giving quality of low cost education to needy people of our northern belt of India. Every year thousands of students are coming out from our educational institutes with best knowledge in their respective field.

Our monitoring process of every program is designed as per the need and requirement of supporting agencies. Generally an expert of our monitoring team member use to visit in our ongoing educational center to see the activities in quarterly basis. We receive progress report in monthly, quarterly & annually. Every month we give our progress report to our potential donors. In the end a detailed final report we submit to our donor.
